The coalition's leadership developed the *Vision 2015* plan in 2006. Ten years later, with Delaware moving on more than 75 percent of the recommendations from that plan, the Vision Coalition collaborated with Delawareans to develop a new 10-year plan.

Starting in January 2014, 4,000 Delawareans shared their ideas, perspectives, and opinions during the plan development process. The result is Student Success 2025. The goal of Student Success 2025 is to prepare every Delaware student for a lifetime of success.

# Requests for the Governor's FY22 Recommended Budget and Delaware General Assembly



#### **Fund Our Future**

Support investments that preserve child care providers' ability to keep doors open and keep costs down for families.

#### Universal pre-K

Support an investment that not only expands access, but raises quality as a step toward voluntary, full-day, high-quality prekindergarten available universally to families in a variety of settings.



## Per-pupil funding for high-need students

Support increasing per-pupil funding for English learners, low-income students, and special education by at least the terms the lawsuit settlement.

#### **Delaware Pathways**
