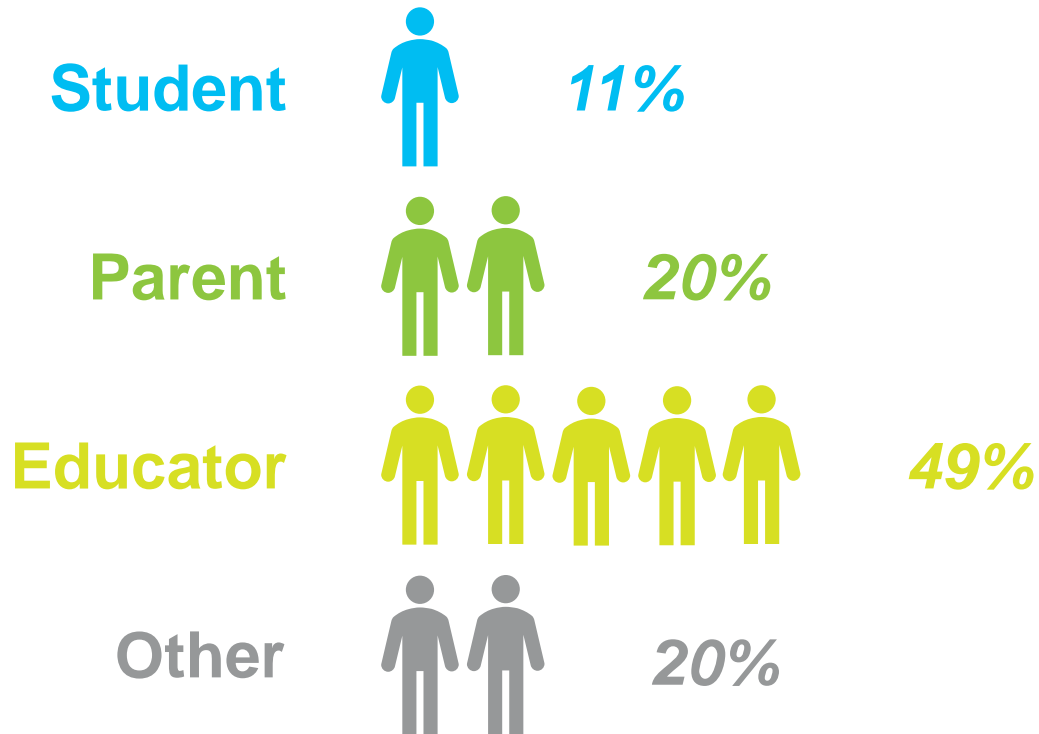


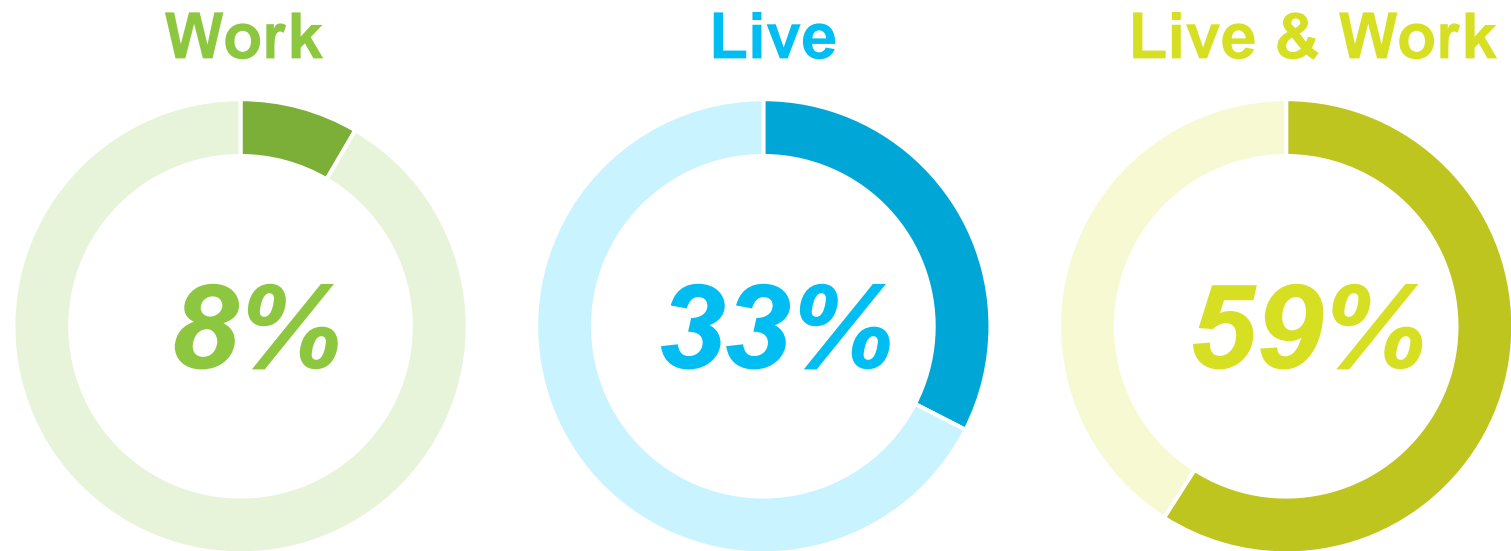

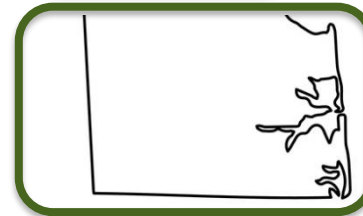

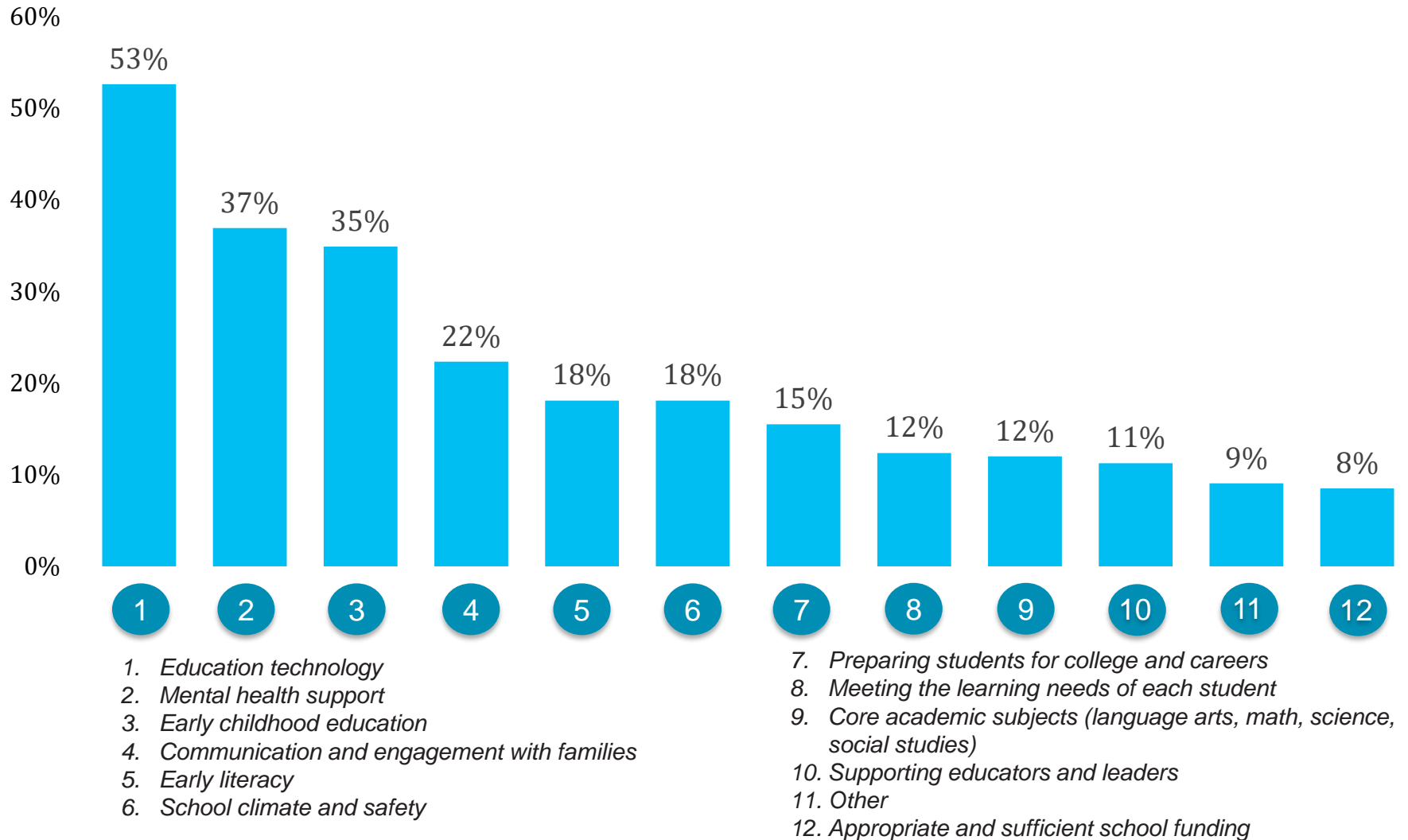

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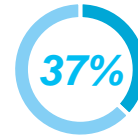

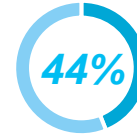
Question 5: In what areas has Delaware's public education system improved or made progress over the last few years? **Top Responses by Group**

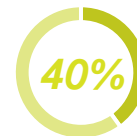

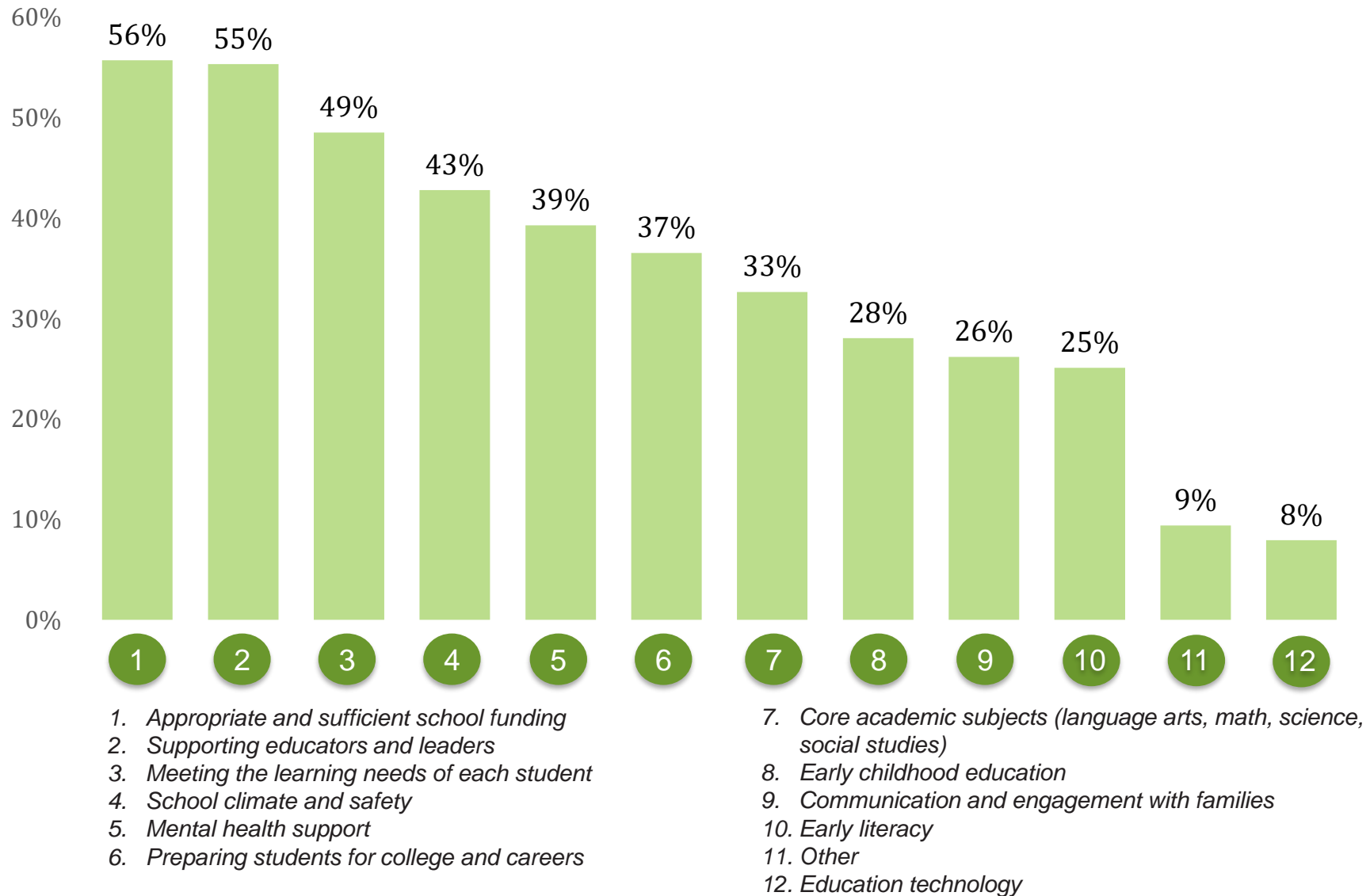

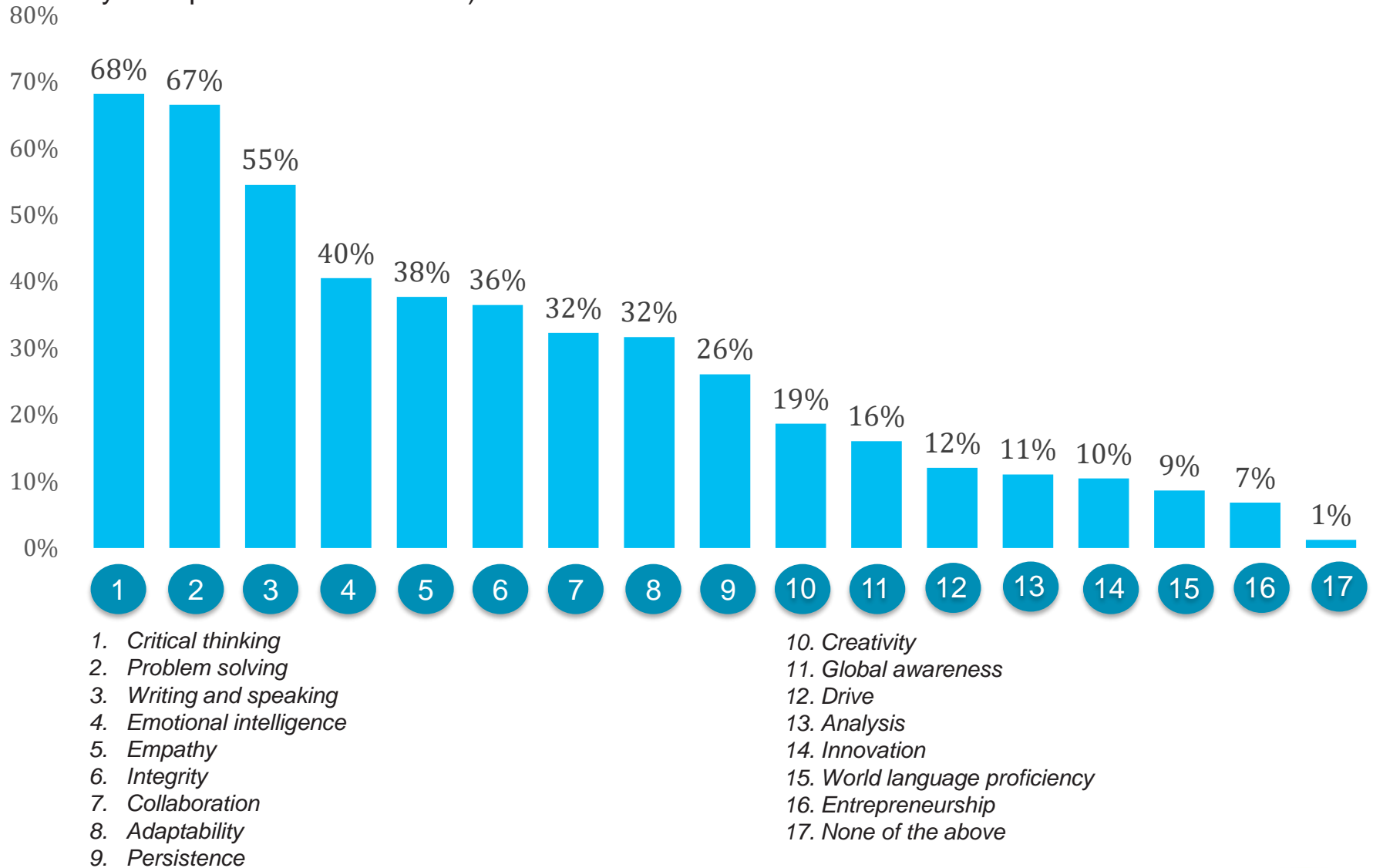

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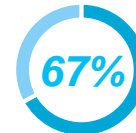

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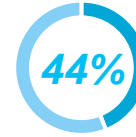

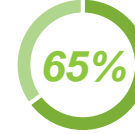

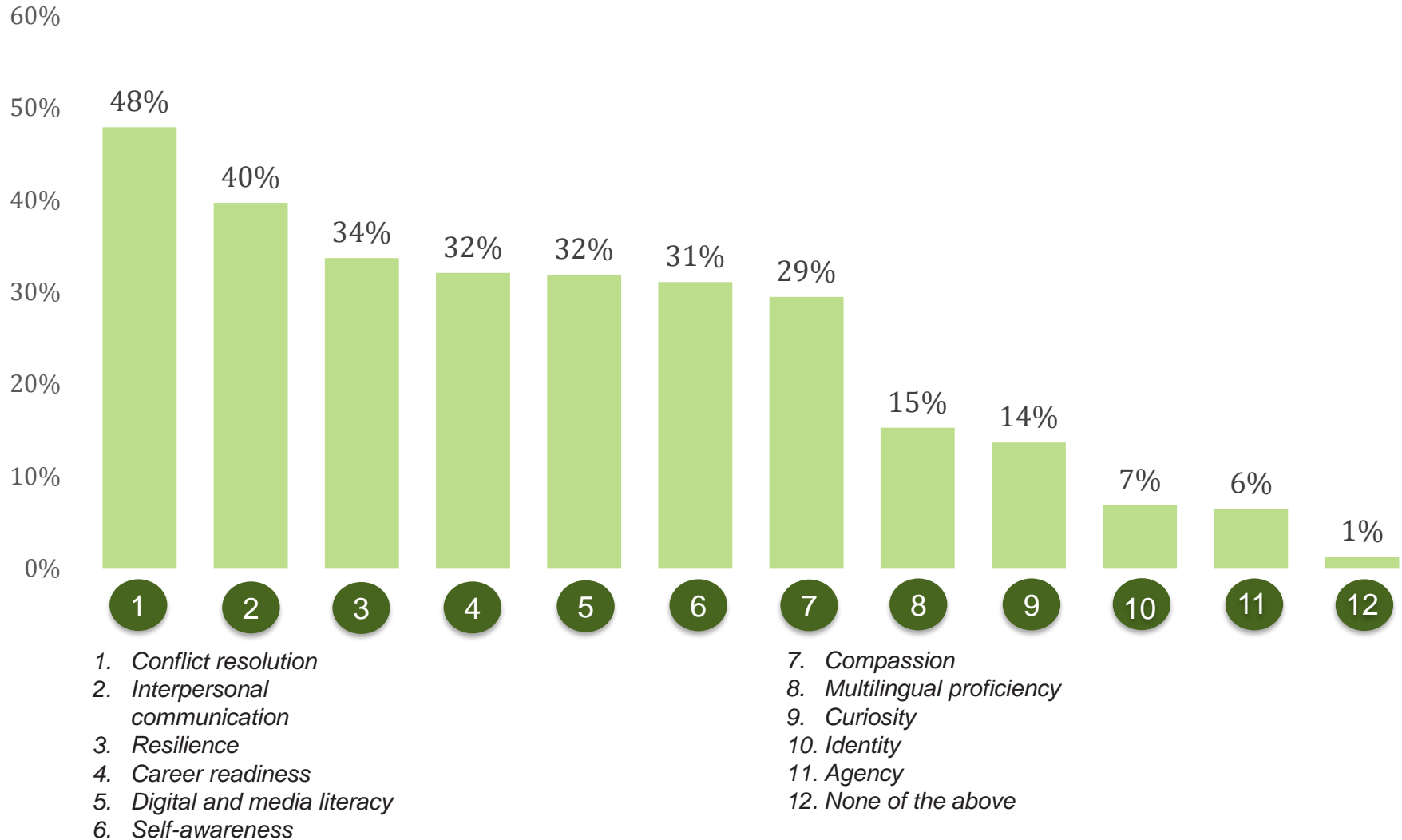

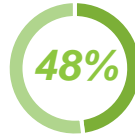

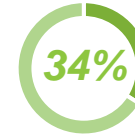

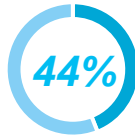

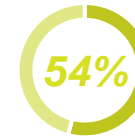

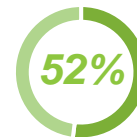

Open-ended responses categorized based on top themes presented

Early Childhood

- **Early childhood system attributes:** affordable, free, adequately funded, inclusive of ages 0-4, mandatory, equitable
- **Early childhood programming that:** exposes children to social skills, creative and positive environments, multiple languages, offers transparent developmental goals and milestones to families or caretakers, has high quality staff and educators, improves reading and math readiness, includes trauma informed care

Student Supports

- **Student Supports system components:** prioritizes mental health support, improves special education resources and funding, improves school safety and school climate, and shows compassion and tolerance

K-12 Academics

- Better train educators on instructional technologies so that they can be effectively leveraged
- Better curriculum **flexibility** and more interactive and **applied-academic learning opportunities**
- More opportunities for educators to explore, create, and share examples of materials developed with UDL standards and **culturally responsive pedagogy** in mind
- Adequate **resources and technology** in all DE schools

Career and College Readiness

- **More diverse opportunities:** More pathways (areas of study), and work-based learning opportunities
- **Paying for college:** Concerns about funding postsecondary education
- **Guidance, awareness, and supports:** Starting career awareness early (before high school) and providing more supports
- **Pursuing a future other than college:** preparing students who will go straight into the workforce
- **Student readiness:** preparing students with “life skills” such as financial literacy and broader non-academic skills that will prepare them for life after high school
- **Design of Vo-Tech versus traditional high schools:** all students getting access to pathways and WBL experiences, high schools need more high quality CTE and pathways programs, while Vo-Tech are full of students who plan to go to college, not study CTE.

Educators and Leaders

- **Working and pay conditions:** Significant concerns around better pay and working conditions (hours, safety, environment, respect, etc.)
- **Training and support services:** Increased access to professional and leadership training, support mentorship and mental health services, encourage STEM workshops and training

Funding

- **Funding system attributes:** equitable, adequate, flexible, needs-based, follows the child
- **Funding system uses:** arts, improved facilities, buildings, teacher pay and support in classrooms, STEM and robotics, trainings, classroom supplies

Our Spanish speaking respondents (n=19) indicated:

- **Delaware has made progress in:** Early Childhood education, Mental Health Supports, and Education Technology
- **Delaware still needs to improve:** School Climate and Safety, Meeting the learning needs of each student, and appropriate and sufficient school funding
- **Important skills that remain today:** Problem solving, critical thinking, and writing and speaking
- **Skills that will be important 10 years from now:** Resilience, career readiness, and self-awareness
- **Delaware should prioritize the following areas in the future:** Early Childhood, Student Supports, Funding, and Educators and School Leaders

Our Haitian-Creole speaking respondents (n=10) indicated:

- **Delaware has made progress in:** Education Technology, Mental Health Support, and Communication and engagement with families
- **Delaware still needs to improve:** Preparing students for college and careers, Meeting the learning needs of each student, and Core academic subjects
- **Important skills that remain today:** Creativity, world language proficiency, critical thinking, and persistence
- **Skills that will be important 10 years from now:** Multilingual proficiency, career readiness, and identity
- **Delaware should prioritize the following areas in the future:** Student Supports, K-12 academics, and Career and college readiness

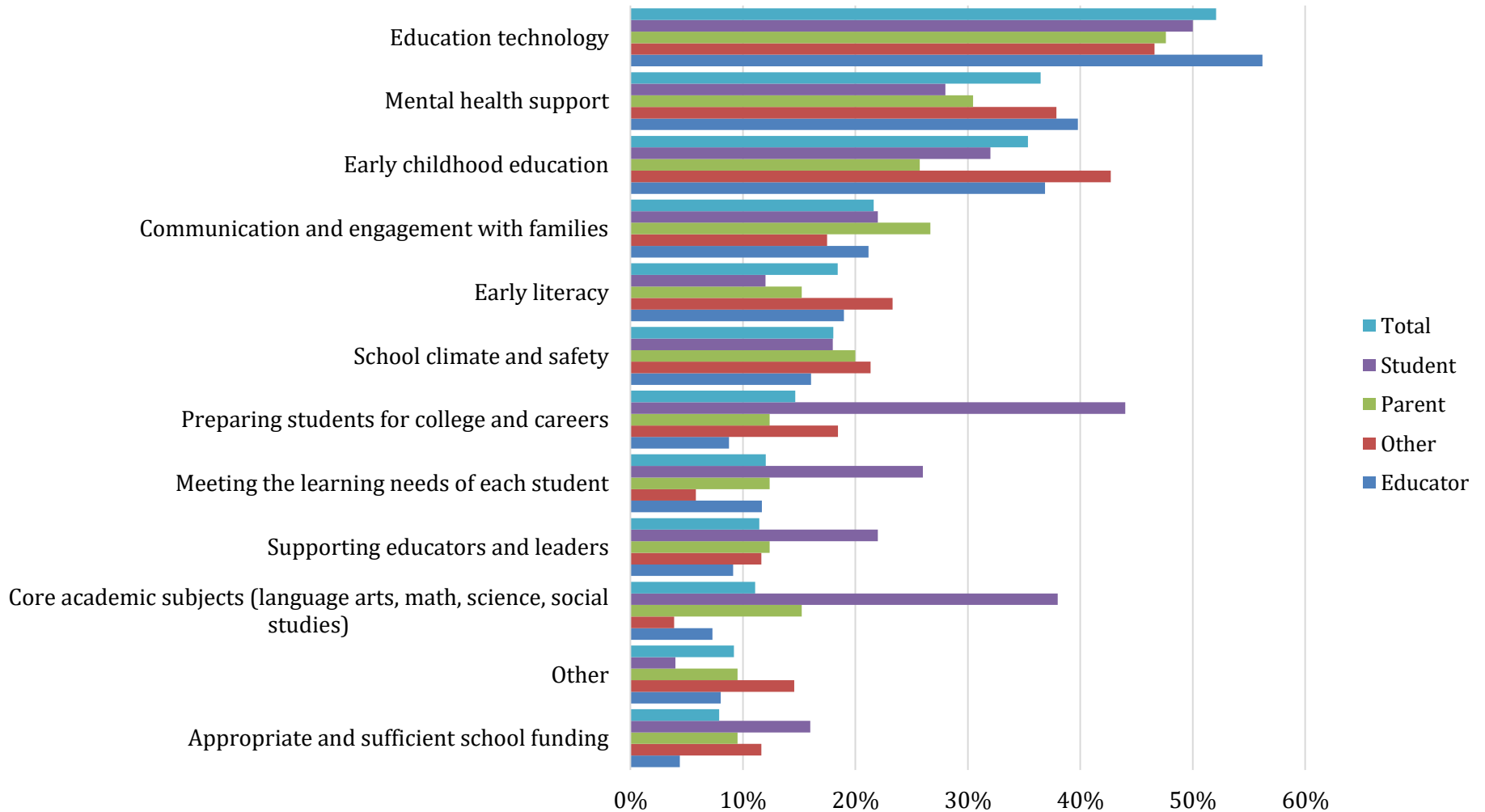

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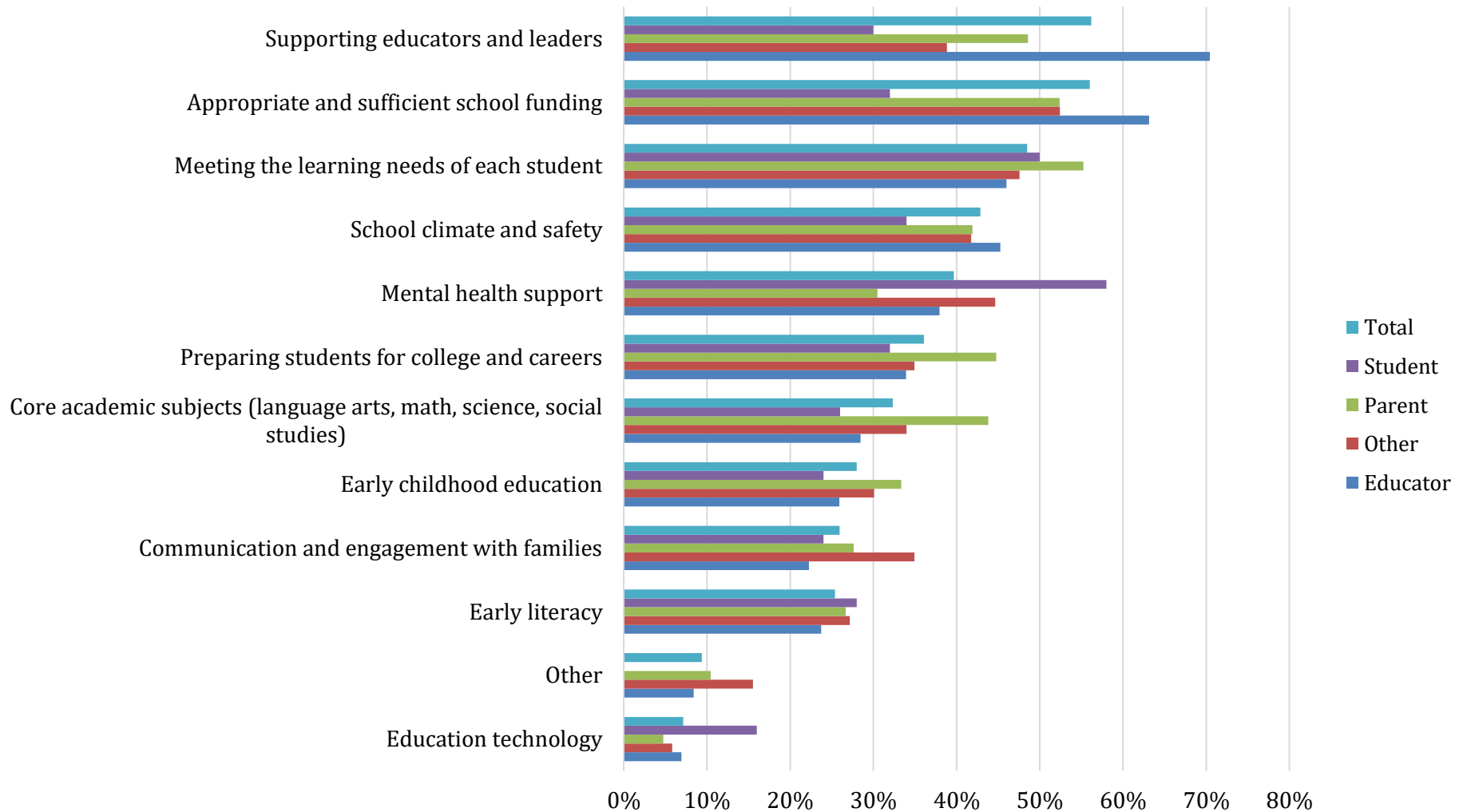

Q5. In what areas has Delaware's public education system improved or made progress over the last few years?



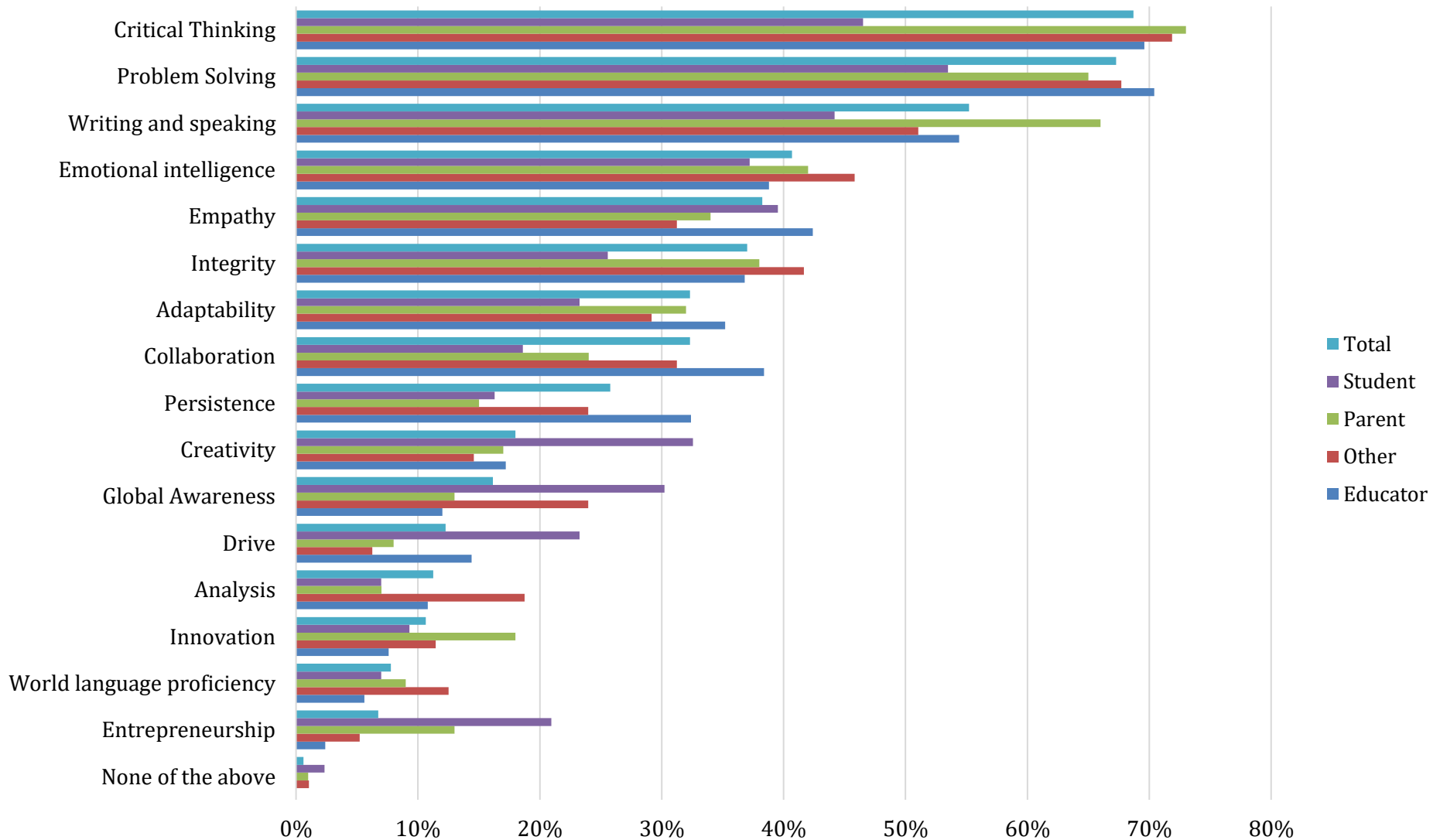

Q6. In what areas does Delaware's public education system still need to improve?



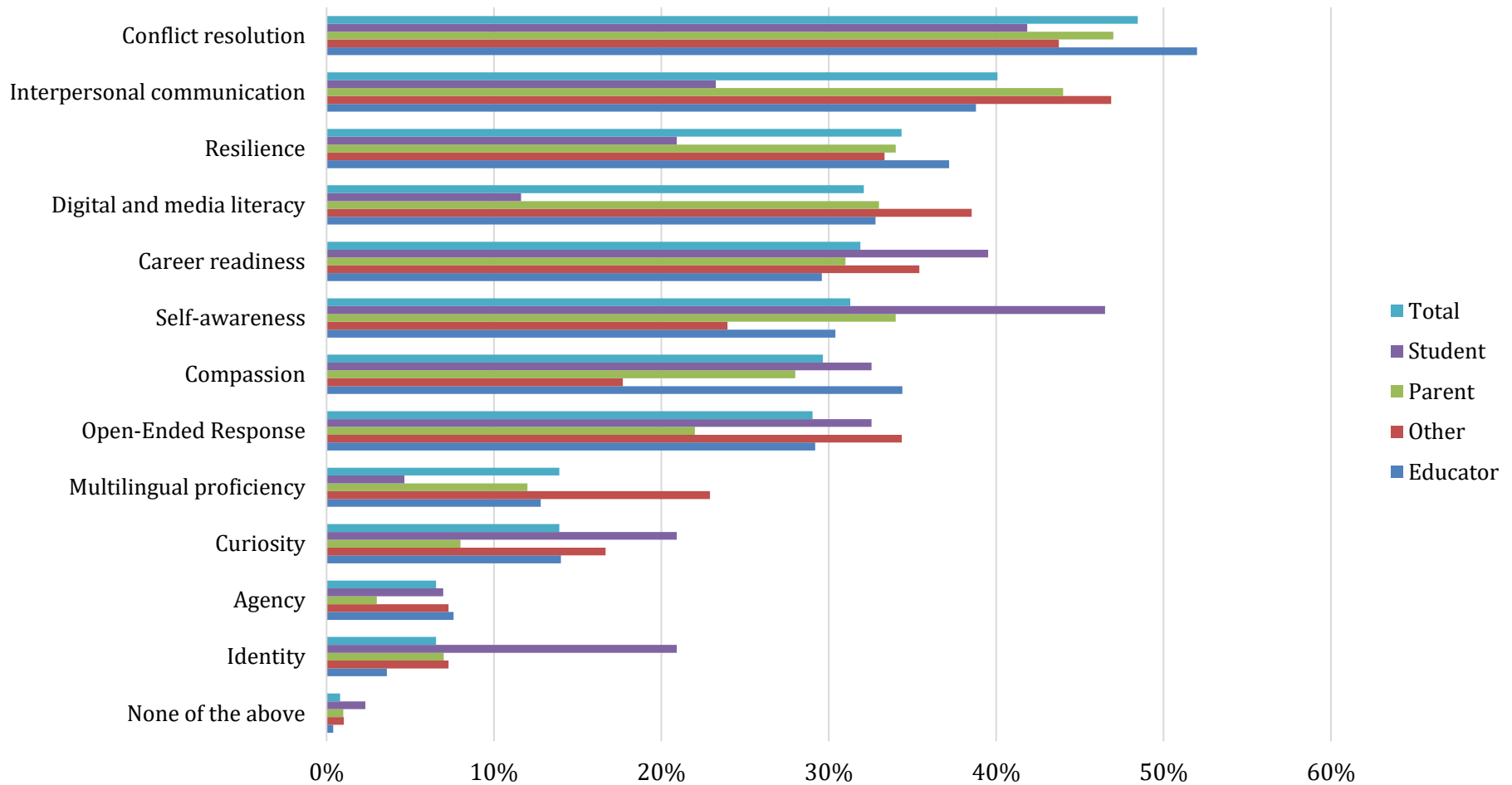

Q7. Which skills and attributes are still important today?



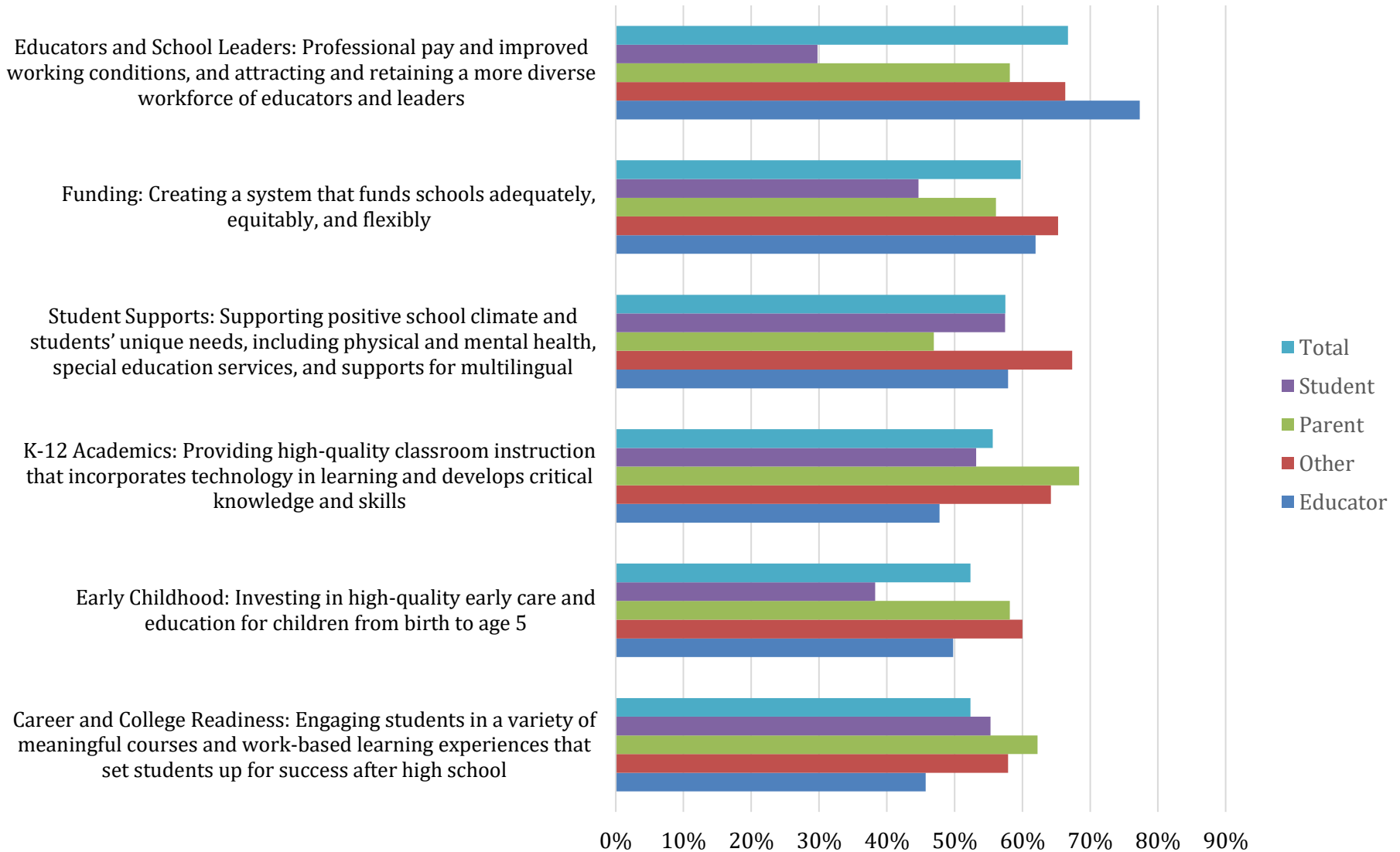
