


Question 1: What best describes you?


Question 4: What is the primary language spoken in your home?

Question 5: In what areas has Delaware's public education system improved or made progress over the last few years? (select a maximum of five areas from the list below)








Question 5: In what areas has Delaware's public education system improved or made progress over the last few years? **Top Responses by Group**



Question 6: In what areas does Delaware's public education system still need to improve? Top Responses by Group











Our Spanish speaking respondents (n=19) indicated:

- **Delaware has made progress in:** Early Childhood education, Mental Health Supports, and Education ٠ Technology
- Delaware still needs to improve: School Climate and Safety, Meeting the learning needs of each student, and appropriate and sufficient school funding
- Important skills that remain today: Problem solving, critical thinking, and writing and speaking
- Skills that will be important 10 years from now: Resilience, career readiness, and self-awareness
- Delaware should prioritize the following areas in the future: Early Childhood, Student Supports, Funding, and Educators and School Leaders

Our Haitian-Creole speaking respondents (n=10) indicated:

- Delaware has made progress in: Education Technology, Mental Health Support, and Communication and engagement with families
- **Delaware still needs to improve:** Preparing students for college and careers, Meeting the learning needs of each student, and Core academic subjects
- Important skills that remain today: Creativity, world language proficiency, critical thinking, and persistence
- Skills that will be important 10 years from now: Multilingual proficiency, career readiness, and identity
- Delaware should prioritize the following areas in the future: Student Supports, K-12 academics, and Career and college readiness






Q5. In what areas has Delaware's public education system improved or made progress over the last few years?






Q6. In what areas does Delaware's public education system still need to improve?




